### About KCCO

For over 60 consecutive seasons audiences have been delighted by the sounds of the Kansas City Civic Orchestra (KCCO), the metro area's premier community-based orchestra. KCCO is supported by over 120 volunteer musicians, our board of directors, and Friends of Civic members. Nearly 100% of our revenue comes from donors, business sponsors, and grants. These generous contributions help us to continue offering our concerts and programs to the community at no cost.

> KCCO's free concerts offer high quality performances of classical and popular favorites. Our music director, Christopher Kelts, creates dynamic interaction between the conductor, the audience, and members of the orchestra. This results in a unique, comfortable atmosphere in which all audience members can enjoy orchestral music.

In addition to offering familyfriendly interactive performances, KCCO also supports the accessibility of classical orchestral music through a range of outreach programs, with a particular focus on underserved groups. Our Instrument Petting Zoo, assisted living facility performances, Young Artist Concerto Competitions, virtual performances, and cooperation with other community organizations such as Band of Angels are all aimed at connecting people with music. We are proud to be an active member of Kansas City's vibrant arts community!



#### **Outreach Programs**

Our outreach programs are designed to both educate and entertain. One of our most popular events by far is the Instrument Petting Zoo for children. The zoo gives kids the opportunity to handle, learn about, and play various instruments - from strings to horns to percussion - coached by members of the orchestra. It's the perfect place to cultivate the interest of budding musicians, and we look forward to offering the zoo once again (with appropriate safety modifications) in 2021.

Educational outreach coordinator Jennifer Mitchell provides additional opportunities for children to connect with music through visits to local schools

throughout the KC metro area. Students listen and sing along to familiar tunes, get to learn about the stringed instruments they're hearing, and even try their own hand at playing.

Local students aren't the only audience to



benefit from KCCO's unique, interactive performances. Jennifer performed virtual programs via Facebook and Zoom during the pandemic, and she is delighted to now be returning to live, monthly performances at six senior and assisted living facilities. The activity coordinator at one facility noted that individuals who have lost the ability to communicate "light up" when they hear familiar tunes, and sometimes even sing along. She described the outreach events as "a lifeline to music, culture, and meaningful engagement."





The Chatelain Young Artist Concerto Competition is open to musicians aged 11 to 18 years. The winner performs their concerto with the orchestra at our final season concert and also wins a cash prize. #### **Concerts**

In response to the Covid pandemic, KCCO canceled most of our live performances for the 2020-2021 season. However, KCCO musicians came together in safely distanced groups for several performances that are now available online. In addition, our Civic in the City series has brought live music to neighborhoods around the KC metro area in the form of small, outdoor concerts. We are proud of and grateful for the dedicated and talented musicians who continued to share their music during such a difficult time.

We are looking forward to offering live concerts once again in 2021–2022,

beginning with a performance at Yardley Hall in October. Our November concert will feature two performances, as will our ever-popular December holiday concert. 2022 will kick off with a March concert conducted by guest Boris Vayner. The season will end with our rescheduled performance at Helzberg Hall
